5TH GRADE NEWS



Our 5th grade spent the fall studying a variety of topics to deepen our understanding about the Wabanaki. We researched on topics of interest, connected with multiple Wabanaki sources, and we created museum exhibits to display our new knowledge. We invited family, friends, and community members to visit our "Museum Walk-Through" to share our learning. As we dove deeper into our studies, we questioned how Wabanaki are represented in our community. We decided to take this on as our project for our PBL.

We realized Camden lacks Wabanaki recognition in our town. We started to investigate what other towns in the state are doing and realized we have some work to do. We think it would be great to start to include signage to show Wabanaki people are here too and this is the land we are on. Signage will also be educational to teach others about Wabanaki ways of life and caring for the environment so we work together to protect our land for generations to come. We wrote to various sources, including Wabanaki representatives and our town manager to see if there was support for this work.

We are working on a presentation for the next Select Board meeting on Wednesday, March 6th at 6:30 to present our ideas and hope the town will support this work.

Five Town CSD Adult Education is offering a new babysitting class for youths ages 11-15. The primary purpose of the Babysitter's Training course is to provide youth who are planning to babysit with the

knowledge and skills necessary to give care safely and responsibly for children and infants, such as diapering, bottle- and spoon-feeding, age-appropriate games, activities, and dealing with uncooperative children. This training will help participants to develop leadership skills and become better babysitters. They will learn how to build a babysitting business, keep themselves and others safe, and learn about basic childcare and basic first aid. The course meets at Camden Hills Regional High School from 4:00-7:00 PM on March 14, 21, and 28.

How and Why to Curb Your Kid's Global Language (And Maybe Your Own!)

A global cognitive style, to use the fancy terminology, means that your perceptions of the world or yourself are broad and overly general: "All dogs are mean" or "I never get anything right." Because this pattern is a solid predictor for depression and anxiety, it's one to recognize and interrupt. We'll talk about how to make helpful shifts in your family.

- **11:30** I connect with our chorus teacher Mr. Maynard about the spring festival being full this year. Bummer! We started discussing making other plans. I chat with Mrs. Seeger in the hallway about a couple of things related to staff support.
- **11:40** Off to fill my water and make a bowl of yogurt, nuts and granola.
- **11:50** I have a phone meeting with a teacher who may want to work in our school district! I hope everyone strives to send good people our way!
- **12:30** I review the website for updates and provide some feedback to the IT director about a few buttons and edits. He makes them in record time holy cow that was fast Mr. Sutch!
