### Appleton Village School Principal Report

- We are serving between 25-30 breakfasts a day.
- We are participating in the Weekend Backpack program for 15 students.
- We have a couple of outstanding lunch bills.
- A letter was distributed at conferences about our Guidance Position. DARE for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade started on Oct. 22, 2018. It will cost \$69.56 per week. We will be contracting with Sequel Care to provide school based counseling starting in November. I met with New Hope for Women, and we will be doing some of their programs.
- K-2 had a great trip to the Apple Orchard followed by a cross graded interdisciplinary morning all about apples. Ms. Helprin came to help out :)
- All AimsWeb and NWEA testing has been completed. Teachers are spending PLC time analyzing the data and developing interventions. The HAL admin team spent their last meeting matching the NWEA scores with the State MEA scores and looking for patterns.
- On October 19<sup>th</sup>, Partners For Enrichment sent out Grade 6 students to the Challenger Center in Bangor for a space mission simulation.
- Congratulations to our boys' and girls' XC teams for their excellent season. In the Busline League Championship, the boys finished 8<sup>th</sup> and the girls finished 4<sup>th</sup>! What incredible improvement from the beginning to the end of the season.
