

## Appleton Village School Principal Report

### Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS)

School-wide positive behavior interventions and supports system helps students learn the behavior expectations for various areas of our school. The clear and concise expectations will improve the school climate and help teaching and learning for all, and is based on our core values of Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Honesty.

**Outcome 1:** As a result of implementing PBIS, office discipline referral for common areas (hallways, outside, cafeteria, bus) will be reduced by 10% over the previous year.

**Outcome 2:** 100 percent of teachers will attend PBIS training, and a result of the training classroom observations will show that all teachers will implement at least one PBIS strategy in their classroom by the end of the year.
